We have a very diligent crew working at the Waterloo smolt trap and just lately have seen the peak of the run go through. A number of volunteers helped Frank at Wilfred Creek dismantle a beaver dam before the road was awash.

Also this May we had a huge donation of trees from the Ministry of Forests. Lise and crew potted up 900 trees and whatever we could not use went to good homes. Many trees went to the Cowichan area, Port Alberni and also to Zeballos.
