Frank Lines

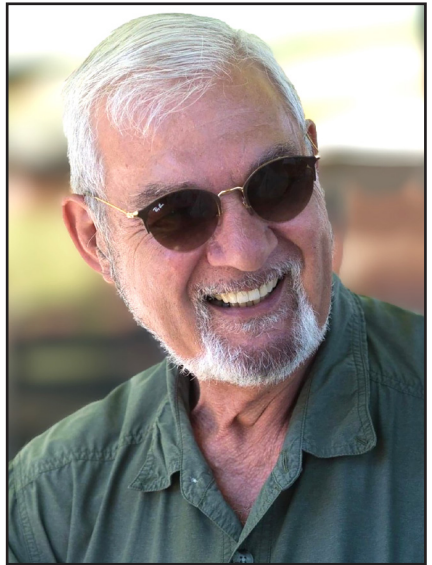
Frank Lines, resident of Courtenay, B.C., passed away suddenly on March 7th, 2023 at the age of 78.
